

New housing options available in Leiden and Geneva

In an effort to provide our study abroad students with the most convenient housing options available, Webster University is always looking for new opportunities to improve and expand our housing. This year, Webster University is excited to announce the opening of our new Living and Learning Center in Leiden, the Netherlands, as well as a new student residence in downtown Geneva, Switzerland.

In Leiden, the new Living and Learning Center is located just 100 steps from our main building in the heart of the old city center. The building was built in 1929 and has always been used for educational purposes. It was initially used as a vocational school for young women and most recently housed a language school. In keeping with this educational tradition, it is now home to Webster Leiden's Living and Learning Center.

There are 50 private studio apartments available as well as teaching facilities, a private courtyard, a workout center equipped with changing area and showers, and several community rooms for convenience. The Center offers on-site resident assistance. The office of Student Services is located inside the main entrance.

In Geneva, Webster University has partnered with the developers of Les Berges du Rhône to provide a student residence that combines comfortable, modern living facilities with spectacular views of the city and the Rhône; adjacent access to public transportation and proximity to all kinds of shopping and entertainment.

The structure is a 100-year-old former Rolex Watch factory that the developers have completely renovated, preserving attractive features of the building while providing high-tech, modern infrastructure that students expect. Significantly, the building generates 30 percent of its own electrical power thanks to 41 solar panels and two heat pumps installed on the roof.
